- 3. This book is designed to be used in either of two tracks of learning. Beginning students may make a survey study by learning the 500 underlined questions. For a more detailed study, all 1000 questions may be learned.
- 4. Questions are divided by subject headings after the NIV text.
- 5. Each question is followed by a reference which tells where the answer is found in the Bible. An "n" in a reference indicates that the answer is found in a footnote below the verse cited. An "ff" in a reference means "and following verses".
- 6. Each unfamiliar word is pronounced at its first occurrence. All pronunciations are listed alphabetically in the Pronunciation Guide on pages 65-68.
- 7. All names in the Pronunciation Guide are identified according to their usage in the gospel of Luke.
- 8. When you have completed your study of this book, add it to your Bible study library or file. If you do not have a library or file, this is a good time to begin one.
- 9. This booklet has been prepared only as an aid in your study of the Bible; it is not meant to replace the Scriptures. It is submitted to you with the prayer that it will help you learn God's Word and that you will continue to study and apply His Word throughout your life.

Levi (LEE-vye) 1. Another name of Matthew, one of the twelve apostles

Levite (LEE-vite) A custodial official of the temple
Lysanias (lye-SAY-nih-us) Tetrarch of Abilene
Magdalene (MAG-deh-lin) An identifying name of a certain woman named Mary
manger (MANE-jer) A feeding crib or trough for animals
Matthew (MATH-you) One of the twelve apostles (See "Levi")
Messiah (meh-SIGH-uh) Hebrew word meaning "the anointed one" (See "Christ")
Methuselah (meh-THOO-zeh-lah) An ancestor of Jesus
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mina (MY-nuh) A variable Hebrew weight and unit of money
Moses (MOE-ziss) The liberator and lawgiver of Israel
Naaman (NAY-uh-man) A leprous Syrian, cured on Elisha's orders
Nain (NAY-in) A town in Galilee
Nazareth (NAZ-uh-reth) A city in Galilee; the hometown of Jesus as he grew up
Nineveh (NIN-eh-veh) Ancient capital of Assyria
Ninevite (NIN-eh-vite) A resident of the city of Nineveh
Noah (NO-uh) A patriarch of the Old Testament who survived the great flood; an ancestor of Jesus
Obed (OH-bed) An ancestor of Jesus
parable (PARE-uh-b'l) A comparison or short narrative designed to teach a spiritual truth
paralytic (pair-uh-LIT-ick) A person affected with paralysis
Passover (PASS-oh-ver) First of three great Jewish feasts, instituted in honor of the "passing
     over" of the Hebrew households by the destroying angel in the time of the exodus
Peter (PEA-ter) One of the twelve apostles, also named Simon
Phanuel (f'h-NOO-ell) Father of Anna
Pharisee (FAIR-ih-see) A member of the most popular sect of the Jews in Jesus' time
Philip (FILL-lip) 1. Tetrarch of Iturea and Traconitis
                   2. One of the twelve apostles
Pilate (PIE-lut) Governor of Judea during Jesus' ministry (See "Pontius")
Pontius (PONT-yuss) Official title of Pilate
priest (PREEST) A leader in Israelite worship
prophesy (PRAH-fiss-eye) To proclaim a message for God
prophet (PRAH-fit) One who proclaims a message for God
prophetess (PRAH-fit-ess) A woman who proclaims a message for God
Quirinius (kwih-RYE-nih-us) Governor of Syria at the time of Jesus' birth
Sabbath (SAB-bath) The weekly day of rest and worship of the Jews
sackcloth (SACK-cloth) A coarse, goat-hair cloth used for making sacks and rough garments worn by
     mourners and repentant people
Sadducee (SAD-you-see) A member of the priestly sect of the Jews in Jesus' time
Samaria (some-AIR-ee-uh) A political district that lay between Galilee and Judea
Samaritan (some-AIR-it-un) A member of a race which originated in Old Testament times by the inter-
     marriage of Jews and Assyrians
savior (SAVE-your) One who saves
Shem (SHEM) A son of Noah; an ancestor of Jesus
Sidon (SIGH-dun) A city on the Mediterranean coast of Palestine, north of Caesarea
Siloam (sih-LOW-am) A pool at Jerusalem
Simeon (SIM-ee-un) A godly, old Jewish man who blessed the child Jesus in the temple
Simon (SIGH-mun) 1. One of the twelve apostles, also named Peter
                  2. Another of the twelve apostles, also known as "the Zealot"
                   3. A Pharisee, in whose house a woman anointed the feet of Jesus
                   4. A man of Cyrene who was compelled to bear the cross of Jesus
Sodom (SOD-um) A wicked city of Old Testament times, located near the Dead Sea
Solomon (SOL-oh-mun) Third king over all Israel in the Old Testament; son of David
Susanna (sue-ZAN-uh) One of the women who ministered to Jesus
synagogue (SIN-uh-gog) A gathering place of the Jews, designed for worship and learning
Syria (SEAR-ee-uh) A nation north of Palestine
Syrian (SEAR-ee-un) A citizen of Syria
tetrarch (TET-rark) A type of ruler among Roman political districts
Theophilus (thee-AH-fill-us) The man to whom the gospel of Luke was written
Tiberius (tie-BEE-rih-us) The Roman emperor during the ministry of Jesus
Traconitis (track-oh-NIGH-tiss) A Roman province northeast of Palestine
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Transfiguration (tranz-fig-your-AY-shun) The supernatural change in the appearance of Christ when he was on a mountain

tunic (TWO-nick) A loose, gownlike garment worn in ancient times

Tyre (TIRE) A city on the Mediterranean coast of Palestine, north of Caesarea

unleavened (un-LEV-end) Without yeast

virgin (ver-jin) A woman who has never had sex relations

winnowing (WIN-oh-wing) Separating grain and chaff by throwing the grain up in the wind (A winnowing fork is used to throw the grain up in the wind.)

Zacchaeus (zack-EE-us) A chief tax collector of Jericho


Zarephath (ZAR-eh-fath) A town of Phoenicia
